In a deeply divided country, one of the greatest and hardest acts of civic engagement is talking to people who don't share our beliefs. But that's exactly what we need to do if we want to solve the problems our country faces and if we want to create a society in which everyone flourishes. Strengthening our social bonds happens when we begin to care about each other again. That begins with a conversation.

This gallery space has been transformed into a social sculpture that invites folks to pause and engage in honest, courageous,

common sense conversations about civic responsibility and national identity. It was inspired by U-M Professor Jenna Bednar, who proposes four pillars of flourishing: community, sustainability, dignity, and beauty.



The artworks have been selected from UMMA's collection to prompt conversations about American identity and the four pillars of flourishing. The wallpaper, designed by Detroit artist Louise Jones (née Chen), illustrates all of the state flowers—a metaphor for flourishing and a symbol of our national unity.

What do you see?

What does each one make you think? (It doesn't matter what the art world thinks!)

Consider:

Who am I? As an American? A community member? A friend? A family member?

What do I care about?

How do I imagine my community flourishing?

Share your thoughts with someone.

(Don't worry, we're all here to learn and share with one another!)

Start with hello (and maybe a friendly smile).

Ask, "What do you think?" "Why do you think that?"

Share with respect, honesty, and curiosity.

You may not agree, but hopefully you'll understand each other a little more!
